Statement of Interest

Why the World Triathlon Corporation should select Vernon as the new home of Ironman Canada:

- Our beautiful location. This community of 40,000 is nestled in the hills of the North Okanagan and surrounded by three lakes, Okanagan Lake, Kalamalka Lake and Swan Lake.
- Our community is tremendously enthusiastic and supportive of hosting Ironman Canada. In only eight days, Council received 722 letters of support from community residents, community groups and local businesses supporting Vernon's bid to be the new home of Ironman Canada.
- Vernon has support from all neighbouring jurisdictions (Appendix A).
- Vernon is committed to exceeding athlete expectations and to delivering not only the highest quality race, but also the safest race experience for all participants.
- Vernon has a demonstrated history of sponsoring large, volunteer intensive, multi venue sporting events, including the Greater Vernon 2012 BC Winter Games, 2011 Sparkling Hill Masters World Cup (Cross Country Skiing), 2008 Telus World Skins Game at Predator Ridge, 2008 Ford World Women's Curling Championship and Funtastic (Canada's largest slo-pitch tournament, and hosted in Vernon for the last 27 years).
- Vernon has an excellent array of recreation and park facilities, including Wesbild Centre (20,500 square feet of flat floored area and spectator seating up to 5,650).
- Over 1,550 accommodation units in hotels and motels are located in the
 City of Vernon alone, in addition to the 850 units (3,100 beds) available at
 Silver Star Mountain Resort (just 20 minutes from downtown Vernon).
 There is also a wide selection of charming bed and breakfasts and
 vacation rentals available throughout the region, as well as hotels and
 motels close by in our neighbouring communities.
- Strong support for the families and guests of the athletes through the "Ironman Family" program.
- Vernon is home to several Ironman finishers and to champion Melissa
 Spooner, as well as being the family home of champion Heather Wurtele.

In addition to the above, the following also serve to make Vernon the ideal location to host Ironman Canada:

- Kalamalka Lake is widely considered to be one of the most beautiful lakes in the world and offers plenty of opportunity for spectators along the route and at Kalamalka ("Kal" as the locals call it) Lake Beach. Kalamalka Lake is unique in that it is a "marl" lake: when the lake warms in the summer, dissolved limestone crystallizes give the lake its distinctive blue and green hue. We are confident this would be one of the best Ironman swim routes in the world.
- Our scenery and topography make the proposed running and cycling routes both beautiful and challenging to participants. We want to provide an epic one loop course that will be memorable to both the athletes and the spectators. There are many attractions, views and charming communities to include on the route, each very supportive of seeing Ironman coming to their community.
- The many route options offer great viewing opportunities for spectators.
 In addition, Polson Park, located in the heart of downtown Vernon, is widely referred to as "the jewel" of Vernon. This would make an incredible centre for event festivities, as it is right in the central business district and easily accessed by Highway 97, Highway 6 and local public transit.
- Accommodations feature Sparkling Hill Resort, a luxury European inspired hotel with 40,000 sq ft of spa services, including North America's first -110 C (-66 F) Cold Sauna (cryotherapy).
- Silver Star Resort offers high altitude training opportunities with beautiful views of the Monashee Mountains, as well as extensive accommodation options to suit all budgets.
- Predator Ridge Resort offers a world class golfing experience along with a hotel and vacation home rental opportunities.
- We have options for a Command Centre for race operations and event storage in the weeks leading up to the event.
- Vernon has a database of over 2,200 experienced and skilled volunteers.
 Our volunteer program, in conjunction with local sponsors, will include recognition, communication, attraction of new volunteers and year round engagement.
- Vernon is easily accessible via the Kelowna International Airport (only a 25 minute drive from the doors of the airport to downtown Vernon). The airport features daily direct flight from major markets such as Toronto, Seattle, Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Ottawa and starting in December 2012, Los Angeles. For those driving, Vernon is located on Highway 97, five hours from Vancouver and six hours from Calgary.



Vernon is easily accessed by the Kelowna International Airport and is midway between Vancouver and Calgary.

The City provides "one stop shopping" for WTC: Tourism and Economic
Development are departments within the Community Development
Division of the City of Vernon. The integration of these services within the
City ensures that there is full cooperation and support on all initiatives.

Strength of Community Support

When Vernon City Council originally considered submitting a bid in response to the request for proposals, it wanted to know how the community and our neighbours felt about it. Council understands that it is important for the community to not only support the event, but to be excited about it.

We are very pleased to report that in only eight days, Council received 722 letters of support from community residents, community groups and local businesses. The City of Vernon also received unanimous support from our municipal neighbours surrounding us, including the local Okanagan Indian Band, as well as the Regional District of North Okanagan and MLA (provincial representative)(see Appendix A for the letters of support from our neighbouring governments).

During this same time, the City of Vernon received tremendous support from local businesses and business associations to bring Ironman Canada to Vernon. Just a sampling of this support included a local pilot offering the use of his helicopter, Immersive Media filming and editing the unique 360 video that forms part of Vernon's bid submission, the local paper donating significant advertising space to request community input on the proposed bid and large retailers offering to volunteer along the route. This support highlights the commitment from the business community that will help ensure Ironman Canada is an exceptional event. See a sample of some of the numerous letters we received in Appendix B, including two from local Chambers of Commerce.

The strong response, enthusiasm and offers to volunteer and support the event provided Council with the assurance that the community and all of our neighbours would welcome and support Ironman Canada. A very small sample of some of the community's comments are included throughout this document.

Exposure for Ironman Canada

The City of Vernon would be proud to host Ironman Canada as the premier annual international sporting event in our region. To that end, and to support the tremendous value already established with the brand, the City would request retention of the title "Ironman Canada", should our bid be successful.

Vernon will provide strong branding on its communications, including the printed media, its web page and electronic media. The City has only recently engaged in social media platforms, and we already have over 1200 connections.

Marketing

The City of Vernon is committed to hosting the best possible Ironman Canada event. In order to ensure success, the external promotion through Tourism, Economic Development and the City of Vernon as a whole will highlight that Vernon is the new home to Ironman Canada. This is a brand that fits with the active and healthy lifestyle that Vernon cherishes and promotes in many of our tourism and economic development initiatives. It is the reason why so many elite athletes call Vernon home.

The target market for much of our promotional efforts has been Greater Vancouver and Alberta. In 2012, the City of Vernon's Tourism department undertook a major marketing campaign in these area and has seen much success. Highlighting Vernon as the home of Ironman Canada will further build upon the region's strengths.

Public Relations

The City of Vernon recently hired a communications officer to assist in promoting activities, events and projects undertaken by the City and our partners. As the City of Vernon is the major stakeholder of the Ironman Canada event, we will offer the support of our communications officer who will work collaboratively with the WTC and the Local Organizing Committee to assist in coordinating media activities and creating a public relations strategy.

Financial Opportunities

The following provides a summary of what the City of Vernon will provide to support WTC and the Ironman Canada Event (City to cover costs related to):

- Permitting, traffic control, traffic control devices and all resident and community notifications related to the race route.
- EMS/EMT personnel related to the route on event day.
- Policing services related to the route on event day.
- Electrical permits and electricians related to the event course.
- Waste management and recycling services related to the route on event day.
- 200 hotel nights throughout the year and event week.
- Support from one Volunteer Coordinator throughout the year.
- Free public transit throughout the City and region on event day.
- Command Centre for WTC staff and volunteers for four weeks before the race.
- 5,000 square feet of secure storage space for the four weeks before the race.
- All rental fees associated with the use of facilities and park spaces that will be needed for the race route, athletes' banquet and volunteers' luncheon.
- Meeting rooms and refreshments for the Local Organizing Committee throughout the year.
- Free parking for WTC staff, VIPs and Team Captains.
- In addition to the above, the City of Vernon will provide a cash contribution to WTC:

o Year 1: \$50,000

o Year 2: \$75,000

o Year 3: \$75,000

o Year 4: \$75,000

o Year 5: \$100,000

Working with local businesses, the City of Vernon will provide the following at no cost to WTC:

- Shuttle service for the athletes on race day.
- Location for one VIP event, with guaranteed stunning views and amenities.
- "Ironman Family" special discounts to area attractions, including suggested itineraries, for the families and guests of all registered Ironman competitors (provided at the time of pre-registration).

We have completed a detailed analysis of our projected in-kind and hard costs, which indicate that they will be substantially higher in the first year as the City is committed to purchasing barricades, pylons, signage and other related materials to effectively manage the race course. In order to assist in offsetting these start up costs, we have proposed a slightly reduced marketing fee in year one. However, we have increased the fee in year five to commit to an average of \$75,000 per year over the term of the agreement. This figure is predicated on a minimum registration of 2,500 athletes. The City would be pleased to discuss the financial arrangement should registration not meet expected targets.

We appreciate that WTC is interested in receiving a portion of the tax revenue that is generated from the event locally. However, in the province of B.C., local governments are not enabled to collect sales tax – this is strictly the purview of the provincial and federal governments.

Term of Agreement

The request for proposals states that WTC is seeking a five (5) year agreement from the host community. The City of Vernon is agreeable to this term to become the new host of Ironman Canada from 2013 to 2017. It is our intention to not only build a mutually beneficial partnership between WTC and the City of Vernon, but just as importantly, with the athletes, families, volunteers, sponsors, community groups and citizens throughout the region to ensure that this is the beginning of a long term relationship.

Vernon is fully committed to the traditional date of the Ironman Canada event — the fourth Sunday in August. We would welcome, however, the opportunity to discuss hosting this event on a different date in August or potentially in late June. June offers fewer large scale events in the region and the Okanagan Valley, thus providing even greater exposure for the Ironman Canada event and providing more hotel accommodations immediately proximate to the event location.

Local Sponsorship

The City of Vernon has received significant interest from our larger corporate citizens to become sponsors of Ironman Canada in Vernon. Many of these companies have chosen to locate in Vernon because of the active lifestyle opportunities the community offers, so becoming involved in Ironman Canada is a natural fit with their company philosophy. The City of Vernon would like to discuss revenue sharing opportunities with the WTC should we be successful in our bid. Companies that have expressed interest include, but are not limited to:

Kal Tire - Kal Tire is Canada's largest independent tire company. Started in Vernon in 1953, Kal Tire was named after Kalamalka Lake. The company has grown to 4,000 employees in over 250 stores across Canada, along with the Kal Tire Mining Group operating in 19 countries. Their commitment to Vernon has again been recently demonstrated as they are in the midst of completing their new 81,000 sq ft corporate office located on Kalamalka Lake Road in Vernon.

Okanagan Spring Brewing - Okanagan Spring Brewing brewed their first beer in 1985. Not long after, the small craft brewery received significant recognition for its now famous Okanagan Spring Pale Ale. The Brewery was purchased by Sleeman's in 1996, which was subsequently purchased by Sapporo International in 2006. Located right in downtown Vernon, the brewery is a strong supporter of community initiatives.

Predator Ridge Resort - The Okanagan's premier golf destination, Predator Ridge Resort is owned by Wesbild Holdings. Wesbild, former owner of Futureshop Canada, has done a variety of major residential and commercial projects throughout British Columbia. Headquartered in Vancouver, Wesbild is a major stakeholder in Vernon and has expressed interest in exploring sponsorship opportunities for Ironman Canada.

Silver Star Resort - Silver Star Resort has won numerous awards for being Canada's best family ski resort. With a variety of lodging options, mountain bike and hiking trails, Silver Star offers Ironman athletes high altitude training set in a unique village centre only 20 minutes from downtown Vernon.

Race Operation Commitment

The following demonstrates the City's commitment to providing required race operation support, including:

Lead Agency and Local Organizing Committee

The City of Vernon would be the lead agency for the event. The City is the economic hub of the North Okanagan with extensive experience in hosting large volunteer intensive sporting events. The City will assist with facility and venue acquisition, permitting, accommodations, volunteer recruitment, public awareness and advocacy. Both Tourism and Economic Development are departments within the Community Development Division of the City of Vernon, and would be the lead in providing all operational, tourism and economic development services to support the event. The integration of these services within the City ensures that there is full cooperation and support on all initiatives.

The City of Vernon is proposing a Local Organizing Committee that would consist of key City staff from various departments representing Public Works, Tourism, Transportation, Community Development and Parks and Recreation. The primary purpose of this group will be to work with the WTC on securing the most appropriate and safest route for Ironman Canada. We will recruit community members that have been actively involved in other major events in Vernon such as the Sparkling Hill World Masters Cup and the BC Winter Games, along with some of the passionate athletes that have been actively involved in Ironman events throughout North America. Depending on the final route location, the City is committed to working with our neighbouring jurisdictions. The City's intent is to maximize the participation of our neighbours to ensure the entire region supports, welcomes and embraces the Ironman Canada athletes, visitors and WTC.

Road Services/Traffic Engineering, Public Works, Resident Notifications and Permitting

The City will work with WTC on developing a road closure and traffic management program. The City of Vernon and its partners will cover the costs related to permitting, traffic control, traffic control devices and all resident and community notifications leading up to the event and on race day. The City wants to ensure that the race course is as safe as possible for the athletes and minimizes any issues for residents and guests.

Police Services

Trained and licensed flag persons will be utilized for traffic control in addition to RCMP personnel. The RCMP will provide support to the flag persons at busy intersections where there is the potential for conflict with motorists. The flag persons would retain primary responsibility for traffic control.

EMS/EMT Services

In addition to the distribution of St. Johns Ambulance vehicles and personnel throughout the route, the City will work with WTC to fully understand the need for additional medical personnel and ensure that this component is fully addressed on race day. It is of interest that Vernon is home to medical practitioners with experience in treating triathaletes, and specifically Ironman competitors, including chiropractors, massage therapists and physiotherapists. Specialized equipment and training systems for Ironman athletes are also available in the community.

The City of Vernon has excellent medical facilities should they be required to support Ironman participants. In 2011, a major 230,000 sq ft expansion was completed on the Vernon Jubilee Hospital. This state of the art facility now includes a new seven story patient care tower, an expanded and modernized emergency department, new operating rooms, intensive care unit and ambulance space.

Waste Management

The City will develop a waste management and recycling plan for the complete race course. This will involve the use of volunteers along the route, coupled with professional waste management personnel.

Shuttle Bus for Athletes

A shuttle bus will be provided to transfer athletes from central locations to the race start and from the finish areas. It is proposed that this service be sponsored by local businesses, particularly those in the food and beverage and accommodations sectors. It would demonstrate to visiting athletes the strong community support that exists for Ironman Canada throughout Vernon and the region.

Free Public Transit on Event Day

In order to help minimize parking issues and inconvenience to residents and guests, free transit will be provided in the City and its neighbouring communities on the event day.

Route and Festival Options

Three proposed route options are included (Appendix C) which showcase our region's landmarks and natural beauty. Each route option includes large areas for the swim start and finish, transition areas, changing tents, finish line, athlete recovery, medical and massage areas, concessions, parking, retail sales and spectator viewing.

The three routes provided are intended to demonstrate the numerous options available. It is the City's desire to work with WTC and our neighbours to determine a route that is best for the athletes' needs and desires, showcases the best of our region and minimizes disruptions to residents and visitors. Ideally, we want to provide an epic one loop course to:

- provide an incredible race experience to the athletes
- provide significant opportunities for spectator viewing, including ease of access and proximity to the majority of accommodations
- promote opportunities for our neighouring communities to be involved and celebrate the Ironman Canada athletes with events that contribute to an incredible experience for the athletes and guests

The Swim

We propose to utilize one of two beautiful lakes in Vernon for the swim portion of Ironman Canada - Kalamalka Lake or Okanagan Lake. The distinct advantage Vernon offers is that both lakes are within the residential neighbourhoods of the community, which allows for exceptional spectator viewing. Due to the location in the Okanagan Valley, the lakes are known as some of the warmest in Western Canada.

- Kalamalka Lake Known as the lake of many colours, Kalamalka Lake
 offers clean, clear and exceptionally warm water. We are confident that
 this can be one of the best Ironman swim routes in the world. With a mix
 of residential development, two provincial parks and agricultural lands on
 the hillsides surrounding the lake, the vantage points for spectators are
 amazing, to say the least.
- Okanagan Lake Stretching from Penticton to Vernon, Okanagan Lake is
 the largest lake in the region. The Vernon arm of Okanagan Lake offers
 both adjacent hillside residential and agricultural lands for a variety of
 spectator vantage points.

The Bike

Vernon has several options for hosting the cycling portion of the race, primarily because we are surrounded by several unique smaller communities to the north, south and east. All of these rural routes showcase the scenic nature of the North Okanagan and our rich agricultural history. Suggested routes include:

- The Southern Route Featuring the community of Lake Country (pop. 11,000) and views of Kalamalka and Wood Lake, the route offers participants sensational views of Okanagan Lake along the return route to Vernon through Commonage Road, including the beauty of Predator Ridge Resort.
- The Northern Route This route brings participants north past Swan Lake and through a variety of small communities outside of Vernon, including the City of Armstrong (pop. 4,800), Township of Spallumcheen (pop. 5,000), City of Enderby (pop. 2,900) and the City of Salmon Arm (pop. 17,500). This route offers cyclists the diversity of views of agricultural lands and hillsides, but also the unique attributes of the vibrant small towns throughout the North Okanagan that have shown tremendous support for Vernon's Ironman Canada bid. This route is extremely popular with local cyclists and motorcycle enthusiasts.
- The Eastern Route This route brings cyclists through the District of Coldstream (pop. 10,000) and to the Village of Lumby (pop. 1,700). The meandering road of Highway 6 showcases a variety of agricultural lands, the Coldstream Valley and the scenic views of the Monashee Mountains in the distance.

The Run

We have proposed three distinct running routes that showcase the lake views that the residents of the North Okanagan enjoy: Swan Lake, Kalamalka Lake and Okanagan Lake. Each route includes a mix of rural areas as well as more densely populated residential neighbourhoods and commercial centres.

Swan Lake – Starting in downtown Vernon, this route brings runners
through the established East Hill neighbourhood and the apple orchards
along Pleasant Valley, L&A and East Vernon roads. Running along these
hillside routes provides exceptional vistas of Swan Lake.

- Kalamalka Lake This route brings athletes through the residential areas
 of Coldstream and south along the western side of Kalamalka Lake.
 Highlights include Kal Beach, Okanagan College, the Ministry of Forests
 Research Forest and the numerous viewpoints of Kalamalka Lake.
- Okanagan Lake This route takes athletes through the Bella Vista and
 Okanagan Landing neighbourhood areas of Vernon and includes both the
 north and south sides of the Vernon arm of Okanagan Lake. Highlights
 include local attractions Davison Orchards, Planet Bee, Bella Vista Farm
 Market, Kin Beach and the Commonage lands.

Facilities, Venues and Auxiliary Spaces

Athlete Check In and Banquet Facility

The preferred location for the athlete registration is the Wesbild Centre, a large arena that can easily accommodate athletes over a three day period, as well as over 2,800 athletes for a sit down banquet. The arena can also accommodate over 3,000 volunteers in a non sit down format for the volunteer appreciation luncheon (see Appendix D for detailed specifications on Wesbild Centre).

Ironman Village and Media Centre

Polson Park is in the downtown and widely regarded as the City's "jewel". It has adequate space to accommodate the 15,000 square feet necessary for 100 exhibitor booths and many more. Close to shops, restaurants, at the junction of two highways and in the centre of the entire race area, Polson Park would also be an ideal location for the finish line and associated festivities.

Vernon can offer different options for a Media Centre. One meeting space is located in our downtown core within the Telus Building. Another is at the Wesbild Centre. Both are set up with phone and internet access, and can easily accommodate 30 people.

VIP Hospitality

Depending on the desires and goals of WTC, several locations are available for hosting dignitaries and VIPs. The use of one location for a VIP event would be covered as part of the City's contribution. These include a range of roof top patios affording excellent views of Okanagan Lake, to opportunities at Sparkling Hill Resort and Predator Ridge Resort. Potential opportunities include:





• Sparkling Hill Resort - Owned by Mr. Gernot Langes-Swarovski, Sparkling Hill Resort is North America's first luxury spa and wellness hotel. Featuring 3.5 million Swarovski Crystals in virtually every element of the property, Sparkling Hill offers 150 luxury rooms, a variety of meeting and hospitality rooms, three 1,200 sq ft penthouse suites and 40,000 sq ft of spa services, including North America's first -110 C (-166 F) Cold Sauna (Cryotherapy). We anticipate that this would be one of the preferred locations for athletes and VIPs to stay while in Vernon.



- Nixon Wenger Law Firm Located in the heart of downtown Vernon,
 Nixon Wenger Law Firm recently completed their 33,000 sq ft office
 building in 2011. The building includes a rooftop patio, board room and
 reception area with views of the downtown and Okanagan Lake.
- Tolko Industries Completed in 2008, Tolko Industries built this 55,000 sq ft corporate office in downtown Vernon. As North America's fifth largest lumber producer, Tolko Industries has continued to grow in the community. Located across the street from Nixon Wenger, Tolko Industries has a rooftop patio and board room to host a VIP event.

Temporary Storage

Pre-event storage options are available. The City has 5,000 sq ft in the central downtown area that would be made available to WTC for four weeks leading up to the event and would be covered by the City as an in-kind contribution.

Command Centre

The City will provide office space in the downtown area to serve as a Command Centre for WTC staff for four weeks leading up to the event.

Volunteer Program

The City of Vernon and its neighbours want to provide an incredible experience for the athletes as well as for their families and guests, the "Ironman Families". Provided as an on-line service (pre registered athletes will acquire a user name and password at the time of pre registration), special incentives, sample itineraries for all ages and abilities and accommodation information would be available to "Ironman Families" throughout the year leading up to the race and during the event week.

The variety of things to do in the Vernon area is broad and inclusive. Our area is known both for its family friendly attractions and its support of local agriculture. Attractions like Davison's Orchards and Farm Market, Planet Bee Honey Farm, Okanagan Science Centre, Historic O'Keefe Ranch, Allan Brooks Nature Centre and Atlantis Waterslides will keep the whole family entertained. For the adults, Vernon is home to Okanagan Spirits, a World Master Class distillery, who proudly use locally sourced ingredients. Plus, we also have a meadery and soon a cidery.

There is an affinity for threes in Vernon. Three Farmer's Markets occur each week with over 140 vendors offering local fresh fruit and vegetables. Three provincial parks are adjacent to the city and feature camping options, mountain biking and hiking trails. Three wineries are located just south of the Predator Ridge area and Vernon sits adjacent to three lakes - Swan, Okanagan and Kalamalka, so wakeboarding, SUP, sailing, paddlesports and boating form a large part of our summer activities.
