

GEOGRAPHY AND CLIMATE

The City of Vernon, the City of Armstrong and the Township of Spallumcheen lie at the northern point of the beautiful Okanagan Valley; situated just 35-50 minutes from Kelowna airport and serviced by routes 97 and 6, making the area easily accessible by road and air for visitors from all zones within province.

With temperatures between 10 and 20°C, 10 hours or more of sunlight and very low rainfall, the fall weather is ideally suited to hosting the 55+ BC Games and offers visitors the opportunity to make the very most of harvest time by visiting one of the many orchards and wineries or hiking a trail to take in the spectacular lake and mountain scenery.



CULTURE

Our small cities' charm melds with our year-round cultural events, festivals and celebrations; there's live music, outdoor theatre, sports tournaments, biking, hiking and wine festivals. Vernon boasts world-class resorts, championship golf courses, outstanding restaurants and first rate shopping, all within minutes of the downtown core.

Vernon is home to a state of the art performing arts centre; The Vernon and District Performing Arts Centre. The society presents three series of entertainments and boasts hundreds of touring musical acts, local talent and community based events on a yearly basis. The city also hosts The Powerhouse Theatrical Society; an award winning Community theatre group which has entertained audiences for over 50 years. Vernon also plays host to one of the most successful film societies in Canada. Films are presented every second Monday at Vernon's Towne Cinema. The Vernon Film Society produces two film festivals per year.

Vernon's downtown core is home to a large public art display in the form of its mural project. This artwork depicts interpretations of period photographs from Vernon's early history. The collection of most of the murals was created under the direction of lead artist Michelle Loughery. The mural project is in a continual state of growth, with new pieces of art being added at regular intervals.

Each winter, Vernon plays host to the Vernon Winter Carnival. First held in 1961, it is now Western Canada's largest Winter Carnival. The City of Armstrong and Township of Spallumcheen are home to the dairy and farmlands of the Spallumcheen Valley, a name derived from a Shuswap language meaning "beautiful valley". These rural communities have their roots based in agriculture, grain farming of alfalfa and wheat, logging, and ranching; a sample of which can be experienced at the historic O'Keefe Ranch. The influence of Dutch immigrants settling in the valley after 1945 is represented by their cheese-making knowledge, allowing Armstrong to become well known for cheese.

Armstrong is also well known for hosting the Interior Provincial Exhibition and Stampede, which has been in annual operation for 116 years. The "IPE" is not just a midway and popular retail show, but still very much a country fair, with contests being held to judge animals, cooking, sewing, hobbies and other items. Additionally, the exhibition offers a variety of entertainment options ranging from concerts, competitions, and the famous minichuckwagon races.

The North Okanagan is a place of outstanding beauty from its colour defying lakes, rolling hills, majestic mountains, beaches, friendly people and days filled with sunshine; creating the perfect backdrop for a most successful 30th anniversary of the 55+ BC Games.

The City of Vernon, Greater Vernon, the City of Armstrong and the Township of Spallumcheen would also like to take the opportunity to recognise the traditional lands of the Okanagan Nation and Splatsin Indian Band. The bid committee have approached and received support from both organisations.

By Car

The northern Okanagan is easily accessible by road and air. The area is serviced by highway 97 the longest continuously-numbered route in British Columbia (and the longest provincial highway in any province), running 2,081 km from the Canada/U.S. border near Osoyoos in the south to the British Columbia/Yukon boundary in the north at Watson Lake, Yukon. BC Transit also links Vernon and Armstrong making a stop right outside the Nor Val Arena and IPE Showground, which will act as both a satellite accreditation centre and the main hub for many of the Armstrong based sports.






MAP 2 - SPALLUMCHEEN AND SWAN LAKE

MAP 4 - ARMSTRONG



CORE EVENT VENUES

Accreditation Centre

The main Accreditation Centre will be located in the Creekside Conference Centre (CCC) of the Vernon Recreation Centre. The CCC is an area of 12,404 ft² and can seat up to 1,000 theatre style, 718 for a banquet, 550 for a cabaret or 800 at a dance. The CCC will easily accommodate tables for each sport and zone with adjoining facilities available if more space is required for trade booths. A large commercial kitchen with 300 place settings is also available.

Ceremony Venues

The opening ceremony will be held at Kal Tire Place, Vernon. Kal Tire Place is a 3,006 seat multi-purpose arena with additional standing room capacity of 500 and a total concert capacity of 5,650. It was built in 2001 and serves as home to the Vernon Vipers Jr. Hockey Club. This indoor facility has good wheelchair access, two permanent concessions and a licenced beverage service. Kal Tire Place will also be the Vernon location for the Dance.

The closing ceremony will be held in the Creekside Conference Centre of the Vernon Recreation Centre. This versatile facility can be quickly and easily converted from the Accreditation Centre to a 1,000 seat concert hall for the closing ceremony.



Medical Facilities

The Greater Vernon and Armstrong area has ample capacity for medical care with three walk-in clinics, the Vernon Jubilee Hospital and a multitude of high calibre physiotherapy clinics. The St John Ambulance has agreed to provide first aid at sporting venues.







BC 55+ Time Trial




